I have reviewed your application for revision of the study listed above. The requested revision involves changes to the protocol and consent form. Your request is eligible for expedited review under FDA and DHHS (OHRP) regulations.

This is to confirm that I have approved your request for revision as follows: review of student assessments and assignments and review of aggregated data from the National Survey for Student Engagement.

4/11/2017: Trained graduate students (or part-time faculty) will de-identify the data, aggregate the assessment data, analyze the results, and report (2c).

Informed Consent - Form submitted. The IRB stipulates that the online consent form must be the first page of the survey and skip logic must be used to prevent anyone who does not agree to participate from access to the survey questions.

As mentioned, there are no risks associated with this project, and data will be anonymous. Names will be removed from student work, and aggregated data will be reported and presented.

Since all students taking general education course(s) receive a course syllabus, all general education course syllabi will include a paragraph about the general education assessment initiative, and there will be a link to a description of the general education assessment initiative on the General Education Program webpage of the Academic Affairs website.

DACs will place a warning at the beginning of any survey or assessment in this study advising

those participating of this IRB, and will also remove any student data connected to birth dates less than 18 years ago before de-identification, aggregation, analysis, and reporting.

Future Risks - Data Storage. Student work will be stored without any identifying information in the Office of the Provost in a D2L folder.
